2007 NATWEST AWARDS DINNER



The 2007 NatWest Awards Dinner was held recently with Chairman of Selectors David Graveney and ex-England and Hampshire batsman Robin Smith being guest speakers.

For the first time in the history of the awards, judges were unable to pick between two players for Cricketer of the Year, so Mathew Hague and Steve Carylton, both of whom play for SCF, shared this prestigious accolade. Steve Carylton totalled 835 runs in the Weekend League this year, including two undefeated centuries. He finished the league with an average of 64.23.

Hague captains both the S.C.F. team and the island side, which came a very respectable second during Jersey's debut in the European Division Two Cricket Tournament, notching up wins against Germany and Norway's national sides.

Hague has scored 830 runs in this season's Weekend League giving him an average of 63.85, he was also successful on the other side of the crease taking 22 wickets, with an average of 16.95.

Hague and Carylton were S.C.F.'s opening partnership and between them they compiled six century stands in 2006, the highest being an undefeated 193 against Guernsey side, Rovers.

For the second year in a row Old Victorians and AirCon. Jersey player Tom Minty has been named as the young cricketer, despite being injured for half of the season. Judges felt that he made an excellent comeback from injury and was rewarded with selection for the Jersey squad travelling to the European Cricket Council Division Two tournament, where he represented the island in four of their five matches. During the Weekend League Minty scored 188 runs at an average of 26.86 and took nine wickets.

Ray Wilson was awarded both the JACUS Award for Services to Cricket and the JCB President's Award.

ECC APPOINT WARD JENNER AS DIVISION 2 REP

Jersey Cricket's Vice Chairman, Ward Jenner, has recently been elected as the ECC's Division 2 Representative for a two year period. The Committee is a new one, designed to replace the old "Tournament Rules Sub Committee" and reports to the main ECC Board. The previous TRSC was unelected and the new Committee is designed to fall into line with the new ECC Governance Structure. The Committee meets twice a year, chaired by Richard Holdsworth and comprising representatives of the 3 European Divisions, the Women's Cricket Representative, the Referees Manager and Umpires Manager. The inaugural meeting of the committee was held at Lord's last month in the Committee Room, the room where all major cricketing issues over the last 120 years have taken place (Bodyline, D'Oliviera Affair etc).

The issues covered during this meeting included, amongst other things, potential Umpire's remuneration, changes in tournament rules re net run rates, future tournament locations, possible introduction of a European Twenty20 Championship and the use of La Manga as a Centre of Excellence for European Cricket.

Ward is delighted to have been elected and added that, whilst his role is primarily to be responsible to European Division 2 Countries, it can only be of assistance to Jersey's quest for Associate Status and to further promote Jersey and the Channel Islands on the World Cricket Stage.

LEVEL 1 COACHES COURSE

The JCCA is running a Level 1 course designed to equip the beginner coach with the skills and knowledge required to introduce and develop cricket amongst young people. The course, which includes excellent resources runs from 5th-7th January at Langford and costs £60 for adults and £40 for those in full-time education.
