WORLD CRICKET LEAGUE

Jersey's World Cricket League Division 5 campaign in Nepal didn't quite go as planned and the team found themselves relegated to WCL6 next year. On the opening day of the tournament, hosts Nepal defeated Jersey by six wickets. Jersey then went on to comprehensively defeat Fiji by nine wickets, coasting to a target of 123 with 29 overs to go. Jersey then faced USA who it had beaten in the Semi-Final of WCL5 in 2008 in Jersey. This time things did not go Jersey's way and the team lost by 66 runs. Following a 27-run defeat by Bahrain, Jersey then faced an uphill battle to stay in WCL5 and had to beat Singapore in their final match of the tournament. Jersey batted first in the must-win game but were all out for just 192 from 48.1 overs. Singapore passed the target within 26 overs, finishing on 195-3 to win by seven wickets. The defeat meant Jersey finished fifth in the table on two points, just above Fiji who were also been relegated. Relegation into Division Six of the World Cricket League means Jersey will now

face rivals Guernsey in the next WCL6 tournament at the end of 2011.

The Jersey squad took time out from the WCL5 campaign to visit an orphanage in Nepal. All 14 players, along with team management, went to an orphanage in Dhapasi, Kathmandu to understand the issues facing young people in Nepal. Captain Ryan Driver and fellow squad member Andy Dewhurst, who are both teachers at Le Rocquier School in Jersey, have committed to fundraising for the orphanage by staging a series of events at their school, which the ICC and Jersey Cricket will also support. Nepal Orphans Home attends to the welfare of children in Nepal who are orphaned, abandoned, or not supported by their parents. The orphanage provides for the children's basic needs of food, shelter, and clothing, as well as schooling and health care, and administers to their emotional needs with love and compassion. WOMEN'S CRICKET

The Jersey Cricket Board will again be aiming to expand Women's Cricket in the Island in 2010. Novice Coaching sessions will begin at Grainville next month on 5th, 12th, 19th, 26th May and 9th and 6th June – all from 6pm until 8pm. These sessions are open to all women who are interested in learning a new sport, improving their fitness and having fun. The sessions are free of charge and are conducted by Jersey Cricket Board staff – Gemma Dunning (Lead Coach), Peter Gough and John Borg.

Following the success of the Schoolgirls Cricket Championships at Les Quennevais last year, the Appleby Schoolgirls Indoor Cricket Championships were held between teams from Jersey College for Girls, Beaulieu, Les Quennevais and Le Rocquier Secondary Schools. Jersey College for Girls are the reigning Outdoor Champions but Beaulieu won the Indoor Championships which were held at Fort Regent.

At present in Jersey there are 2 women's cricket clubs and any girls who enjoy their cricket are encouraged to get in touch with Katie Ridley at the Jersey Nomads Cricket Club or Vicky Toole or Marcia Lee at the Jersey Lillies Cricket Club for more opportunities to play. These two clubs play regular hardball matches against each other.

ICC MEDAL PRESENTATION

The JCB recently presented ICC Centenary Medals to 5 stalwarts of Jersey Cricket - David Hunt, Chris Minty, Trevor Moore, Ray Pearce and Ray Wilson.

David Hunt has been involved in cricket in Jersey since 1959 and is still currently a member of the Committee of the Jersey Island Cricket Club and loyal umpire for the Jersey Association of Cricket Officials.

Chris Minty is currently Jersey's Director of Cricket but had worked voluntarily for Jersey Cricket from 1970 and has coached countless of the Island's children since 1985. Without Chris, Jersey Cricket simply would not be where it is today.

Trevor Moor was Vice-President of the Jersey Island Cricket Club, Chairman of Selectors for Jersey Cricket, gave over 30 years service to umpiring in the Island and was Secretary of the Jersey Association of Cricket Officials. Trevor has only recently retired from service to Jersey Cricket and still enjoys watching the game.

Ray Pearce has been coaching Jersey children since 1975 and is a leading figure in the Jersey Cricket Coaches Association and the Jersey Junior Cricket Association. Ray has inspired many children to take up and continue playing cricket and has coached many of today's adult players. He is still involved in coaching children today.

Ray Wilson is well-known in Jersey for his services to umpiring and was President of the Jersey Association of Cricket Umpires and Scorers for 7 years. He has been the driving force behind JACUS since it was formed in 1991 and he still umpires today on a regular basis. Until recently, Ray also looked after all the umpire appointments for the Island for many years – an extremely difficult and time-consuming task!

CI SPORTS PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR AWARDS

The Sportingbet Channel Islands Sports Personality of the Year Awards were held in Jersey this year with guest speaker Harry Redknapp. Cricket featured in two nominations – the Jersey U15 cricket team were nominated for the State Street Junior Team of the Year and Guernsey's Jeremy Frith was nominated for the Sports Personality of the Year Award. In the end the Guernsey Commonwealth Junior Fencers Sabre Team took the Junior Team of the Year Award and Guernsey tennis star Heather Watson took the coveted Sports Personality of the Year Award after winning the US Open Junior title last year. The U15 cricket team were nominated after beating Scotland and Ireland in the ICC European Division One Tournament in Scotland. Rain ruined Jersey's chances of winning the title and the team eventually came second on run-rate.

INSIDE EDGE by Mark Saralis

This is the 5th year of the Rathbones Handicap, again generously sponsored by Rathbones, and it is as competitive as ever with over 100 players entered. Although, in theory, anyone should have an equal chance of winning, the four winners to date have several characteristics in common.

They have all:

1. Had a handicap of between 36 and 47
2. Been experienced cricketers
3. Played the majority of the season's matches
4. Been Senior Island players.
5. Three have been batsmen who have bowled a bit but who took a far higher than expected amount of wickets in their winning season. Dean Morrison broke the trend by being the only player that was purely a batsman but did have to score five 100s to clinch it. But no-one has successfully defended their title and he has a handicap 17 points less than last year so he could struggle to win it again. That gives us a shortlist of just three: Andy Dewhurst, Jon Gough and Tony Carlyon and I have a sneaking suspicion that it could be Carlyon whose name is inscribed on the cup at the end of the season. There are several other players with juicy looking handicaps who will fancy their chances and you cannot discount Ryan Driver. Alternatively 50% of the winners had the initials D.M. (Dave Morfee in 2006, Dean

Morrison in 2009) which gives Daniel McAviney and Duncan Maccabe a squeak.

The rules

Players receive their allocated handicap every game they play and will be credited with extra points (in League matches only) as follows:

1 pt per each run scored

20 pts for each wicket taken

20 pts run out – direct hit (scorers please record on scorecard)

10 pts per catch

20pts per stumping

Extra points are awarded as follows

10 pts for scoring 50 in a match or taking 3 wkts

20 pts for 100 or taking 5 wkts

10 pts for 3 catches/run outs/stumpings or combination

20 pts for five catches/run outs/stumpings or a combination

Not Out batsmen

Score 0-9 = 3 pts

10-19 = 5 points

20-29 = 8 points

30-39 = 12points

40-49 = 16 points

50+ = 20 points

In the event of a rained off match all those due to play will receive 100 points.
