EUROPEAN CHAMPIONS

Jersey won the recent ICC European Division 1 Championships in Jersey.

Jersey were unbeaten throughout the tournament and topped the table with Ireland A second and Scotland A third.

Jersey's opening match was against Denmark who won the toss and chose to bat first making 164 for 7 in their 50 overs. In reply Jersey reached 167 after 40.4 overs with the loss of 5 wickets. The match was notable for the 100th international appearance of Carsten Pedersen for Denmark who became the first Dane ever to reach this milestone.

Jersey then threw the championships wide open when they beat Ireland A in their second match, cruising to a seven wicket victory. Ryan Driver and Chris Jones reduced Ireland to 39 for four after Ireland chose to bat first. Ben Stevens then took 2 wickets and Ireland were struggling on 61 for six before eventually being bowled out for 128 after 45.2 overs. Dean Morrison and Ed Farley had an opening partnership of 63 with Driver and Morrison then adding another 41. Jersey completed the runs required with nearly 20 overs to spare.

With Italy beating Scotland A, Jersey were in pole position to win the tournament. Jersey proved too strong

for Netherlands A, winning by 77 runs and followed that win up with a fourth, beating Scotland A by 6 wickets.

Jersey's fourth success in as many matches guaranteed them top spot in the championships. Ireland A were the only side that could have drawn level on points with Jersey but, in a change to the rules, the title would have gone down to the result of the head-to-head match played between Ireland A and Jersey which Jersey had comfortably won. Ryan Driver won Most Valuable Player of the tournament.

ICC EUROPEAN U19 CRICKET WORLD CUP QUALIFIERS

The ICC European U19 Cricket World Cup Qualifiers took place in Belfast recently with Scotland and Ireland qualifying for the U19 Cricket World Cup and Jersey in third place.

Jersey won their opening match against Denmark cruising to victory by 8 wickets in only 16 overs. Jersey's second match against the Netherlands was much tighter - Jersey batted first making 140/8 but the Netherlands failed to score off the final delivery and Jersey scraped through by just one run! Jersey faced Guernsey in their third match and totally outplayed the Sarnians, with a winning margin of 153 runs. Jersey went into their fourth match of the tournament knowing that a win over Ireland would ensure a top two finish and a guaranteed place in next year's ICC U19 World Cup Global Qualifier. But it was Ireland who kept their WCQ hopes alive by beating Jersey by 123 runs at Bangor. However it wasn't as convincing a performance as the score suggested and for periods of the contest, Jersey were very much in the game before ultimately falling away. Jersey's final match was against Scotland who clinched the European Championships with a convincing all round display, beating Jersey by 109 runs.

ICC EUROPEAN U15 CHAMPIONSHIPS

Jersey's U15 squad competed in the ICC European Division 1 U15 Championships in the Netherlands. Title-holders Scotland faced runners-up Jersey in the opening match and the Scots won by 74 runs in a rain-affected match. Jersey recovered the following day to record a 71-run victory over Denmark and the highest total of the day with 168 runs, 52 of those coming from Edward Fricker. Rain continued to affect the tournament as Guernsey's game against Scotland was abandoned whilst Ireland beat Jersey by 142 runs with Jersey losing their last 9 wickets for only 25 runs. Jersey then took on Guernsey with Edward Fricker again scoring the runs, this time 48 of them from 73 balls. Jersey eventually closed on 193 for five. Guernsey were 115 for 3 in the 28th over and looked set for victory before Dominic Blampied took 3 for 32 and Guernsey ended on 176 for nine. Jersey's final match was against the Netherlands who, after four successive defeats, bowled their way to a win dismissing Jersey for 85 in 39.1 overs. The Dutch eventually won with seven overs to spare. Jersey eventually finished in fourth place just behind Guernsey.

GUERNSEY WIN INTER-INSULAR

The Inter-Insular was held at Grainville this month in front of a good crowd from both Islands. Jersey won the toss and chose to bat, ending their innings on 195-9, Ed Farley top scoring with 40. GH Smit took advantage of Jersey's poor batting with figures of 4-26. Jeremy Frith of Guernsey then made an unbeaten 56 as Guernsey made 199-4, with Captain Stuart Le Prevost sharing an unbroken fifth wicket stand of 61. This was Guernsey second Inter-Insular win in a row and they lifted the new Marlborough Trophy after the game. Jersey Coach Craig Hogan paid tribute to Guernsey's performance but was disappointed with Jersey's. "It was a long way short of the standards we want to set in the field – with the bat and with the ball. It was a disappointing all-round effort today." Jersey and Guernsey will next meet in 2011's World Cricket League Division Six Championships which are likely to be held in Malaysia.

STANDARD BANK U16 COUNTY FESTIVAL

Surrey beat Berkshire in a Twenty20 final to win the Standard Bank Under-16 County festival.

Surrey, Hampshire, Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Yorkshire, Wales, Berkshire and Jersey competed in the Festival – the longest running youth county cricket festival in the British Isles.

After a rain-affected week, the final day's action saw a variety of limited overs matches played on the astro-turf wickets at FB Fields due to waterlogged pitches elsewhere. The afternoon ended with Surrey beating Berkshire in a Twenty20 match to win the tournament.

At the presentation ceremony that followed, Berkshire's Stuart Parsons picked up the award for Performance of the Tournament for his knock of 94 against Wales whilst Surrey's Adam Dyson won Player of the Tournament.

Standard Bank's Dave Gorman thanked all the players for their participation in the festival and wished them the best of luck in their future cricketing careers.
